

Emergency Medical Responder II

10-Day Course

Program Description

The Emergency Medical Responder (EMR.) program is designed to provide introductory level training to pre-hospital personnel. The EMR II program is directed towards persons whose primary responsibilities include providing patient care and assisting persons with more advanced training (i.e. Paramedic) in providing patient care. In the event that the EMR II is the most highly trained person, he/she will provide direction and guidance to the EMR I in the delivery of patient care.

The EMR II program is 10 days in duration and is offered via traditional classroom delivery. Participants will be evaluated on their “hands-on” performance for the “skills” sessions. Also, written examinations will be used to measure the participants cognitive skills, whereas, case scenarios will be used to assess the participants psychomotor skills for evaluation.

General Information

Successful completion of the Emergency Medical Responder training does not automatically qualify the graduate to work in the ambulance industry for the province of Newfoundland and Labrador. To work as an EMR, graduates must apply for registration with the Registrar for Land Ambulance for the province. Registration documentation includes:

- Proof of valid Class 4 Drivers Licence
- A Certificate of Conduct from local Police
- An Oath of Confidentiality signed by a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner of Oaths
- Successful completion of an EMR Training Program

Some ambulance services may require candidates to successfully complete a physical capabilities test.

Application Process

Individuals interested in this training are required to complete an official College Application Form and submit along with the required prerequisite documentation to the Business Development Officer at the nearest campus.

Class Schedules

Specific dates and locations for program offerings may vary. This course is offered upon demand and scheduling may occur at any time during the academic year. Please contact the campus nearest you for information on course availability.

Entrance Requirements

Interested applicants are required to submit the following documentation with their application:

- High School Diploma or Equivalent
- Current Certification in HCP (Health Care Provider CPR + AED)
- Valid Standard First Aid Certificate (2-day)
- Valid Drivers Licence – Class 5 (Optional Class 4)

Tuition Fee

The tuition cost for this program is \$1,050. Additional costs for Textbook (\$110) and Student Manual (\$20) apply.

Once applications have been received and screened for prerequisites, applicants will be issued a Letter of Acceptance. Applicants may be eligible for sponsorship or subsidy funding. For information on funding opportunities, please contact the Business Development Officer at your local campus.
