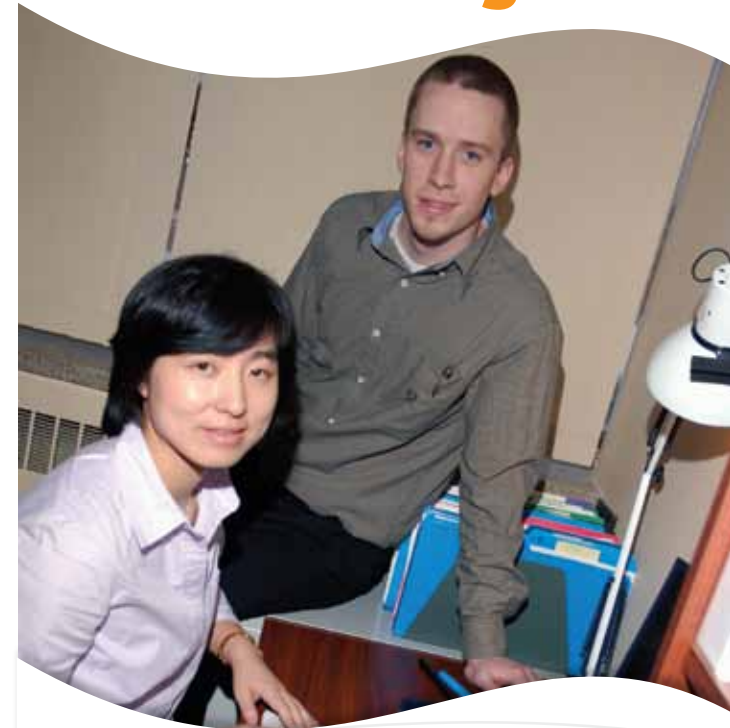

### **The Supply Management Training Program:**

College of the North Atlantic is partnering with the Newfoundland and Labrador Institute of Purchasing Management Association of Canada (NLIPMAC) to offer Supply Management Training courses. Today's global market demands skilled entry to mid-level practitioners to support the management of increasingly complex upstream and downstream components of extended supply chains. PMAC now introduces a series of courses and seminars in supply management to meet this need for proficiency in functional area processes and technical competencies.

Supply management training consists of introductory technical courses, soft skill seminars and business management seminars. Participants can access either a single course or seminar, or can complete the entire program and earn a Diploma in Supply Management from the Purchasing Management Association of Canada.
