Please note: Students may be expected to travel for clinical placements which will mean additional cost for travel and accommodations.

Students accepted into programs in the School of Health Sciences must submit their Program Awareness form and proof of current immunization status prior to registration. Your immunization record can be obtained from the Department of Health. Prospective students should NOTE CAREFULLY that while the College may admit students to a course of studies in the School of Health Sciences, the right to practice is granted only through the appropriate authority of the Province in conjunction with national registration/certification bodies. Applicants with prior convictions or offences, or mental/physical disabilities should communicate with the appropriate organization involved

If your program of studies has a clinical or field placement and you obtain a clinical or field placement with the Health Boards, you will be required to provide a Certificate of Conduct and Vulnerable Sector check prior to this period. The Certificate of Conduct/Vulnerable Sector check can be obtained from your local police department or the RCMP.

There is a processing fee payable to them for this certificate.

Students must submit proof of current CPR/HCP and Standard First Aid training certificates. Please note: certification must be up-to-date or you will not be permitted to register.

Other Fees include equipment/materials fee, health/dental fee, and annual registration fee, etc.
