PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The program will consist of the following course areas:

Math - Basic Concepts

English - Reading skills, grammar, sentence structure, vocabulary development, listening and speaking skills

Science - Basic concepts in biology, chemistry, and physics

Skills Development - study skills, time management, research skills, budgeting, self determination, healthy relationships, effective parenting, effective communication, balancing school and work, critical thinking, wellness, stress management, and motivation

Aboriginal Health Initiatives - overview of common diseases; includes the exploration of traditional medicines and methods of staying healthy

Career Development - exploration of interests, personality, values, skills, and abilities

Using Technology - introduction of basic skills as well as to develop research skills

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Aboriginal Bridging program is a one year program designed for Aboriginal students to ensure they have the necessary skill levels to enter into college level programs. The focus will be on both academic and personal skills development.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Students must have high school graduation certificate or equivalent or meet the criteria to apply as a mature student.
