Students accepted into programs in the School of Health Sciences must submit their Program Awareness Form and proof of current immunization status prior to registration. If your program of studies has a clinical or field placement and you obtain a clinical or field placement with the Health Boards, you will be required to provide a Certificate of Conduct prior to this period. The Certificate of Conduct can be obtained from your local police department or the RCMP. There is a processing fee payable to them for this certificate.
